Welcome Address

Grant Hehir

Auditor General for Australia,
Australian National Audit Office &
Patron of the RMIA

Grant Hehir commenced his term as Auditor-General for Australia on 11 June 2015.

Before his appointment as Commonwealth Auditor-General, Grant served as the Auditor-General of New South Wales (NSW) between November 2013 and June 2015. He worked for the State Government of Victoria between 1998 and 2013 in a number of senior roles including as Secretary of both the Department of Treasury and Finance and the Department of Education and Training. He also served as Chair of the Victorian Leadership Development Centre and CenITex, and as a Director of the Treasury Corporation of Victoria and the Victorian

Funds Management Authority.

Prior to this Grant worked in senior executive roles within the Commonwealth Department of Finance and Administration. He is a fellow of CPA Australia and the Institute of Public Administration Australia.

Jerry Grayson AFC

Helicopter Rescue and Film Pilot

Jerry Grayson is an ordinary man who chose an extraordinary career. He was just 17 years old when he joined the Fleet Air Arm, the youngest helicopter pilot to ever serve in the Royal Navy. By the age of 25 he was the most decorated peacetime naval pilot in history and was awarded the Air Force Cross by the Queen for outstanding gallantry in search and rescue.

Rescue Pilot: Cheating the Sea details Jerry Grayson AFC's story, offering an inside view of his heroic service. It is an inspirational and celebratory account, excitingly told, frequently funny and highly poignant. The significance and quality of this work is underlined by the foreword,

which was written by Prince Andrew.

The work of a search and rescue pilot is vital, dangerous, thrilling and on the edge. Hear how Jerry saved a wounded fighter pilot who was ditched at sea, rescued desperate sailors from sinking ships during the infamous Fastnet Yacht Race – in which 25 yachts were lost – and picked up a grievously ill crewman from the deck of a nuclear-armed submarine that was playing a cat-and-mouse game with the Soviet navy.

In 2500 hours of flying with the Royal Navy, Jerry and his crewmates saved more than 70 lives on 120 rescue mis-

sions. His story is not an account of one man's deeds, but a salute to all the men and women he worked with who were able to turn tragedies into triumphs.

Jerry's adventure didn't stop when he left the navy. He has since set up Helifilms, a production company specialising in footage shot from helicopters. The company has contributed to the likes of Black Hawk Down, An Inconvenient Truth and the James Bond film A View to A Kill.



Keynote: Climate Change: The Real Nature of the Challenge

Will Steffen is an Earth System scientist. He is a Councillor on the publicly-funded Climate Council of Australia that delivers independent expert information about climate change, an Emeritus Professor at the Australian National University (ANU); Canberra, a Senior Fellow at the Stockholm Resilience Centre, Sweden; and a Fellow at the Beijer Institute of Ecological Economics, Stockholm. He is also an Adjunct Professor at the University of Canberra, working with the Canberra Urban and Regional Futures (CURF) program, and is a member of the ACT Climate Change Council. He is chair of the jury for the Volvo Environment Prize; a member of the Inter-

national Advisory Board for the Centre for Collective Action Research, Gothenburg University, Sweden; and a member of the Anthropocene Working Group of the Sub-committee on Quaternary Stratigraphy.

From 1998 to mid-2004, Steffen served as Executive Director of the International Geosphere-Biosphere Programme, based in Stockholm, Sweden. His research interests span a broad range within the fields of climate and Earth System science, with an emphasis on incorporation of human processes in Earth System modelling and analysis; and on sustainability and climate change.

Insurance & Care NSW (iCare) was created on 1 September 2015 to deliver the State's insurance and care schemes. Gavin joined iCare in November 2015 as their inaugural Chief Risk Officer (although his LinkedIn profile says "Chief Risky Dude").

Gavin is part of iCare's Executive Team and he manages the Risk & Governance area.

Prior to joining iCare, Gavin was the Chief Risk Officer at Zurich Financial Services Australia Limited.

Gavin has also held senior actuarial positions in a number of large insurance companies. Before moving to

Australia in 2008, Gavin worked at the Accident Compensation Corporation in New Zealand where his last role was Chief Actuary.

Gavin has a Masters degree in Statistics, an MBA from Henley Management College and is a Fellow of the Institute of Actuaries of Australia (FIAA). He is currently studying towards a Graduate Certificate in the Psychology of Risk at ACU.

Steve McIntosh was admitted to the NSW bar in 1984. At that time, he was working as an Associate to a Commissioner of the Australian Industrial Relations Commission. He subsequently earned a BA (Honours) in History while continuing to work with the Commission.

In 1990, Steve transferred to the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, where he worked in the Department's legal office for around six years.

From late 1995 until late 1999, he was posted to the Australian Permanent Mission to the International Atomic Energy Agency and other international organisations in

Vienna. While in Vienna, Steve represented Australia in discussions on a wide range of nuclear and arms control issues. He also took on international leadership roles in negotiations on issues such as nuclear liability and radioactive waste management.

In early 2000, Steve joined the Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation (ANSTO), and assumed responsibility for the government and regulatory liaison aspects of what was known as the Replacement Reactor Project. Since the completion of that project with the commissioning of the OPAL Reactor in 2007, Steve has assumed responsibilities in relation to govern-

ment and international affairs, including the possible use of nuclear power in Australia. During his time at ANSTO, Steve has also continued to lead negotiations at the International Atomic Energy Agency on nuclear liability, safety and security of radioactive sources and security of nuclear facilities. He is the current chair of the IAEA International Expert Group on Nuclear Liability (INLEX).

Steve assumed his current position as Senior Manager, Government and International Affairs at ANSTO in July 2015. In that capacity, he is responsible for ANSTO's interactions with Ministers and their offices, with Federal, State and Local Governments and

with international nuclear organisations and ANSTO's counterpart organisations in other countries. He is Australia's National Representative to the IAEA Regional Co-operative Agreement for Nuclear Science and Technology in the Asia-Pacific.

Denham Hitchcock is a Reporter for the Seven Network's flagship Sunday Night program. He has more than 22 years experience in TV news and current affairs and has had a front row seat to some of the biggest historical events in recent memory. He has reported everywhere from the front lines against Islamic State in Iraq, to the red carpet at the Oscars. He's told inspirational stories, conducted memorable interviews and has seen the best and worst of mankind. Denham began his career in news straight out of high school at the age of 18, and worked his way through the ranks. During his career his roles have included being

chief of staff, producer, executive producer, editor, reporter and foreign correspondent.

He has worked in seven different newsrooms in three countries, including two years in London and four years in Los Angeles as the U.S Correspondent for Channel Nine.

From the pressure of daily news and constant live crosses, to long format documentaries and current affairs, Denham has worked on shows ranging from the Today Show, Sunrise, the main 6pm news bulletins, 60 Minutes and Sunday Night. It's been a career that has taken him around the globe, from North America to

Steve wrote his first lines of computer code at age 10. He is one Australia's most respected futurists and business technologists. He has an incredible ability to make sense of how emerging technology applies to your industry.

He is a born entrepreneur, and had his first startup at age 12 – an organic egg farm before the words “organic” or “startup” had been invented! He even started a clothing business part time and managed to build up the business to a point where he sold it. He used to start work at 5 am, sell to customers at lunch time and do the administration at night. After completing studies in

Economics and Finance at University he worked in multiple Fortune 500 companies including Proctor & Gamble, SAB Miller, Kimberly Clark, Mondelez (Kraft / Cadbury), WPP (the world's biggest media company). He held many senior positions culminating in Directorships before decided to revert to his true passion for technology. His experience means he intimately understands the disruptive forces many established companies are facing today.

Steve has had multiple technology startups and he launched one of the first 'Sharing Economy' startups Rentoid.com, before Uber or Airbnb. Steve had a successful

exit selling the startup to a public company. He now invests in emerging technologies and has multiple advisory board positions in startups involved in a variety of disruptive technologies across the Airline Industry, Automotive, Real Estate & Co-working, Internet of things, Quantified Self, Mobile applications, and 3D Printing technologies. Steve is heavily involved in the startup scene in Shanghai, China and has a passion for the culture. He travels there regularly for business and even speaks Mandarin.

Extreme projects are something Steve loves doing, in order to demonstrate what is

possible today. He knows how to generate attention in the modern age of marketing with a number of his viral videos to his name. He recently built a full size driveable Lego car from 500,000 pieces. It has an engine made completely from Lego, and it runs on air. He also crowd funded the project on Twitter. It has over 8 million views on Youtube and was a global news story. He also put a toy space ship into earth orbit for under \$2000 to prove how cheap powerful technology has become.
